Be ready in the event of an emergency

The City of Saint John updated its public Emergency Notification System, effective June 30, 2021. You can sign up to receive emergency alerts by visiting <u>www.saintjohn.ca</u>

The new email, voice and text notification system is used by the Saint John Emergency Management Organization and City of Saint John to broadly communicate urgent public safety notices.

All residents, including those signed up in the former emergency notification system, will need to sign up in the new system to receive notifications.



The "Spotlight Creative Placemaking" pilot is underway

Funded through the City Economic and Community Recovery Fund, the program is championed by InterAction School of Performing Arts. In the first stage of the launch, artists were encouraged to submit their applications to a jury for feedback, and next they'll be bringing their art to the public. Projects include a Healing Garden, original song lyrics written in conjunction with a neighborhood association painting on buildings, traffic calming murals, swing dance in the park, and more. Waste Wise pilot program update

The Waste Wise pilot program is designed to make things easier for our residential customers by introducing curbside recycling and limiting garbage.

Since kicking off in two neighbourhoods on May 20, and five pick-ups complete in each, we would like to thank those who have participated and offered their feedback so far.

Results of the program are being tracked and numbers are trending in the right directions! As of July 14, in the Rockwood area, on average 52 per cent have taken advantage of the curbside recycling pick-up 40 per cent are composting: and 15 per cent have put out extra bags of waste.

As of July 20, in the Latimore Lake area, on average 53 per cent have taken advantage of the curbside recycling pick-up; 40 per cent are composting; and 20 per cent are putting out extra bags of waste.

As a reminder, recycling is picked up the night prior to your regular garbage and compost collection. Residents participating in the program should have their recycling out the night prior, no later than 11 p.m. and garbage and compost out by 7 a.m. the following morning.
