Training for the Fire Department's new Rapid Deployment Craft (RDC) took place in February. This inflatable boat is used to assist with ice and water rescues. As a City fortunate enough to be surrounded by waterways, this new RDC is a critical piece of equipment to have on hand.





SUMMER FIRE TIPS



The use of outdoor BBQs, grills and firepits is part of summer fun! Here are some tips to minimize fire hazards when enjoying these outdoor activities. Remember, if a fire breaks out, call 911 immediately.

- Regularly check your propane tank hose for leaks
- Never leave equipment unattended
- Keep equipment a safe distance from anything that could burn such as overhead branches, eaves, deck railings and siding
- Follow proper directions when using fuel and fire starters
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids on firepits, chimineas or campfires
- Always have a hose, bucket of water or shovel and dirt nearby

Did you know...

FIRE HYDRANT PAINTING

Saint John Water paints every fire hydrant bonnet a different colour for a reason? The colour coding serves as an indicator to the first responders of what the available water flows are at that specific

BULK WATER

Saint John Water operates two bulk water stations in order to provide easy bulk water access to customers in need? The bulk water stations are located at 5 Alloy Drive (off King William Road) and 784 Loch Lomond Road. To access Bulk Water, customers can create an account by contacting 658-4455 during regular working hours.


Saint John Water, along with Agua Data Atlantic, has an annual Unidirectional Flushing Program? Unidirectional flushing is a method of strategically flushing drinking water pipes to improve water quality by removing sediment.

WATER/WASTEWATER TESTING

The City is required to complete 10,000 combined water/wastewater quality tests annually to ensure safe, clean, and clear drinking water and properly treated wastewater effluent? As a municipality, we exceed these requirements by performing an additional 30,000 tests to provide award-winning drinking water to our customers!

SEWER VIDEO INSPECTION PROGRAM

Saint John Water has a sewer video inspection program that inspects 65,000 meters of sewers annually? During the sewer video inspections, we find everything from water leaks to grease, rags, and wipes. Please help by ensuring not to flush any wipes or rags and to dispose of grease and fats through your household garbage.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING



WASTE WISE PILOT PROGRAM

The Waste Wise pilot program was launched to make things easy for residential customers by introducing curbside recycling and limiting garbage. Since the program kicked off in May in the Rockwood and Latimore Lake areas customers have really taken to the new program.

As of July 14, in the Rockwood area, on average 52 per cent have taken advantage of the curbside recycling pick-up, 40 per cent are composting, and only 15 per cent have put out extra bags of waste!

As of July 20, in the Latimore Lake area, on average 53 per cent have taken advantage of the curbside recycling pick-up, 40 per cent have composted, and only 20 per cent have put out extra bags of waste!

LEAF AND YARD WASTE PACKAGING

On July 1, the Fundy Regional Service Commission implemented changes to the acceptable packaging for leaf and yard waste disposal. These changes are part of ongoing efforts to reduce the use of plastics throughout the Saint John region.

To ensure pick-up of your leaf and yard waste with your compost:

• Place any excess leaf and yard waste in brown paper leaf bags.



Did you know you can book the City's Green Machine? Designed and packed to help citizens keep our community clean, the 14' Green Machine trailer provides groups with a free mobile toolbox that has all the equipment you need to help with clean-up initiatives in our parks and public spaces.

PARKS AND RECREATION

A PARTNERSHIP ON ICE

On July 10, Mayor Donna Reardon participated in a ribbon-cutting ceremony to celebrate the City's partnership with the Lord Beaverbrook Rink (LBR) to provide ice time to youth in the community this summer.

The LBR Board is operating the Peter Murray Arena for the new summer ice program and have collaborated with several local businesses to be able to offer the ice time to families free of charge!



SUNSHINE PROGRAM

The City launched its annual recreation program for children on July 28. The Sunshine Program is a free eight-week program for children ages 6-

12, offered at four municipal parks from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

There have been 226 children registered in the program this year, participating in activities such as kayaking, geocaching, swimming, hiking, soccer, puppet and variety shows, crafts, softball clinics, sandcastle building, activities provided through Brilliant Labs, and more.



DIVING IN FOR PUBLIC SAFETY

Did you know that the City completes underwater beach checks at five primary swimming beaches in advance of official openings each season? As part of the inspection, divers check for any safety hazards that could affect swimmers!



PUBLIC WORKS

WATERLOO STREET RECONSTRUCTION

The \$1.8 million reconstruction of Waterloo Street from Haymarket Square to Castle Street is well underway and scheduled to be completed by early September 2021. The work involves replacing the existing cast iron watermain and terra cotta sewer as well as the installation of a new storm sewer.

The street and sidewalks will be reconstructed, and grass medians and trees will be planted. In addition, the Waterloo Street/Haymarket Square intersection will be reconfigured to allow vehicles traveling down Waterloo Street to make a righthand turn at the intersection and head towards Crown Street.



Residents will notice portable speed display signs on various streets where the community has expressed concerns about

speeding. The signs notify motorists when they are speeding and encourage them to slow down to the posted speed limit. They also collect data to help measure performance of this new tool.





AUDIBLE CROSSWALK MESSAGING

As part of the MoveSI Transportation Plan, the City has updated crosswalks with audible messaging to further enhance safe access for all pedestrians. All 35 current and future APS crosswalks will include audible messaging in both English and

French. The goal of MoveSI is to allow each citizen the ability to use the transportation mode of their choice and do so safely.





KEEPING OUR STREETS TRAFFIC-READY

Did you know the City has 400 km of traffic lines, and 3,235 traffic marking symbols to paint? So far in 2021 we've used 3,573 litres of white paint for lines and traffic symbols and 4,784 litres of yellow paint for lines!



FEDERAL FUNDING FOR FLOOD **RISK MITIGATION STRATEGY**

Public Safety Canada has provided funding to the City under the National Disaster Mitigation Program administered by the Province of New Brunswick. This funding will go towards the development of an action plan outlining how to best mitigate the impacts of climate change in the Lower Cove Loop area, a picturesque neighbourhood that overlooks the Bay of Fundy.

The project is valued at \$90,000, with 50 per cent being provided by the Federal government and 50 per cent funded by the City.

Development Activity

Development activity and permitting applications in the City remain strong! As of the end of June 2021, the number of new units created in the City was 2.5 times higher than the six-year average over the same time period.

Approximately 600 additional units are planned, including market and affordable housing, over the next several years pending Council approval.



Saint John Night Market

The Night Market provides the perfect venue to support local business while socializing with friends and neighbours! And new for 2021, The Saint John City Market is now open to the public on Thursday evenings as well. With over 25 vendors each week, this mix of permanent and pop-up vendors means there really is something for everyone.

Investment In Fundy Quay

In February, the federal, provincial and municipal governments announced a major investment in a multi-phased infrastructure project to prepare the Fundy Quay site in Saint John's inner harbour for future development. Work has begun to repair the sea wall and the first portion of the site is expected to be turned over to the developer for building construction sometime next year.

Sidewalk Café **Permit Waiver**

Did you know that The Municipal **ENCORE Program: Sidewalk Café** Rebate Initiative was launched in 2021 to support the hospitality sector within our Business Improvement Area? The COVID-19 economic recovery initiative effectively waives Sidewalk Café permit fees and associated parking fees up to an approved \$20,000.

The program has been a huge success, with 16 Sidewalk Cafés installed in the Uptown – 13 at new locations!
