Saint John Fire Department reminds residents about fire safety for fire prevention week

The Saint John Fire Department is reminding residents of the importance of fire safety and prevention as national fire prevention week runs from October 3-9, 2021. This year's theme "learn the sounds of fire safety" is an important reminder to know what to listen for when it comes to the sounds your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms make.

"Understanding what the sounds mean, whether it's a full alarm, an indication to change your alarm's batteries, or to replace the alarm is critical to ensuring everyone's safety," said Roy Nolan, Captain of Fire Prevention and Investigations for the Saint John Fire Department. "Everyone in your home needs to know what sounds to listen for. If you or a family member are hard of hearing, then consider getting a strobe light or bed shaking alarm to make sure everyone is alerted to an emergency. And remember that fire prevention always starts with having a plan."

City Market staff, vendors and customers have adjusted well to new COVID safety protocols

Daily operations at the Saint John City Market have been modified to meet most recently announced provincial COVID-19 orders. The hours of operation for the solarium (considered indoor dining) have recently changed to 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. weekdays and 8:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, and temporary security has been hired during these times to check vaccine paperwork of customers.

The Saint John-EMO will be testing the emergency notification system this Thursday, October 7, 2021

The Saint John Emergency Management Organization (SJ-EMO) will be conducting a test of the emergency alert and notification system this Thursday, October 7. The test will be conducted late in the morning. Anyone who has signed up to receive emergency notifications and news from the City will receive an email, voice, or text alert with the message “EXERCISE, EXERCISE, EXERCISE. This is a test of the City of Saint John emergency notification system. No action is required. THIS IS ONLY A TEST.”

The email, voice and text notification system is used by the SJ-EMO and the City of Saint John to broadly communicate urgent public notices. Residents who have not signed up to receive alerts and notifications are encouraged to do so by visiting www.saintjohn.ca.



Saint John Culturescape has been postponed with a new date to be announced

The SJCulturescape was originally scheduled for September 24– 26 but has been postponed until a later date due to the recent reinstatement of the COVID-19 emergency order.
