2. Approval of Minutes

2.01 Minutes of September 14, 2021

8. General Correspondence

8.01 Internal Monthly Report / September 2021

Deputy Chief Hayes reported that during the month of September there were three (3) complaints, one (1) complimentary correspondence and zero (0) grievances.

8.02 SJBPC Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021

Craig Lavigne, Senior Finance Manager reported that the Commission's preliminary August 31, 2021, financial results are anticipated to be \$16,948 (23.25%) positive

variance. Expenditures are underbudget by \$20,440 and wages and benefits are over budget by (\$3,492).

On motion of Secretary Costello Seconded by Commissioner Killen

RESOLVED, that the Saint John Board of Police Commissioners Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021, be received and filed. (O2110-04)

Question being taken, the motion was carried.

8.03 SJPF Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021

Craig Lavigne, Senior Finance Manager reported that the Force's preliminary August 31, 2021, financial results are anticipated to be \$356,443 (2.22%) positive variance. Salaries and wages are underbudget by \$323,398 and expenditures are overbudget by (\$66,945). Overall wages and benefits are under budget and can be attributed to savings due to personnel changes.

Year-end projections are estimated to show the Force coming in underbudget by \$62,185 or 0.26%. Salaries and wages are projected to be underbudget by \$171,982 due to retirements and vacancies. Goods and services are projected to be overbudget by (\$121,820) which is mainly due to additional costs of IT infrastructure. The revenue is estimated to be overbudget by (\$12,023) by year end.

On motion of Secretary Costello Seconded by Commissioner Kelly

RESOLVED, that the Saint John Board of Police Commissioners receive and file the Saint John Police Force Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021, and send a copy of the report to the City of Saint John Finance Committee as part of their reporting requirements. (O2110-05)

Question being taken, the motion was carried.

8.04 Public Safety Communication Centre (PSCC) Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021

Craig Lavigne, Senior Finance Manager reported that the PSCC's preliminary August 31, 2021, financial results are anticipated to be a deficit of (\$147,958), or (19.22%).

Expenditures as of August 31, 2021, are underbudget by \$5,463 and wages and benefits are over budget by (\$63,077).

Overall year end projections show the Centre being over budget by (\$242,166). Approximately (\$117,850) of the shortfall related to revenue estimates. The budget was based on providing services to additional service areas; however, the onboarding of these areas will likely not occur in 2021.

Year-end estimates for expenditures show a deficit of (\$124,316). The main drivers are overtime.

On motion of Commissioner Kelly Seconded by Secretary Costello

RESOLVED, that the Saint John Board of Police Commissioners receive and file the Public Safety Communications Centre (PSCC) Unaudited Financial Results as of August 31, 2021, and send a copy of the report to the City of Saint John's Finance Committee as part of their reporting requirements. (O2110-06)

Question being taken, the motion was carried.

Chair Keyes gave an update around the Strategic Plan stating that the process is underway, and they expect a draft will be coming back to the board from the consultants, and they hope to have it released in the very near future.

At this time the media were invited to ask questions of the board.
