Saint John Common Council approves General Fund and Utility Fund capital budgets for 2022

The budgets focus on enhancements to quality of life for residents, while also addressing the City's infrastructure deficit and supporting the renewal of community assets

Both budgets were approved at the meeting of Common Council on November 15, 2021.

Together, the budgets will invest approximately \$6.35M into quality-of-life initiatives, with a strong focus on tax-based growth, public safety, greening and beautification efforts, recreation, active transportation, asset renewal, and a vibrant waterfront. The budgets leverage significant funding opportunities from other levels of government, and are directly aligned with the City's financial policies, growth and quality of life plans, and Council priorities. Winter is on its way! Be prepared when an overnight parking ban is declared by the City

A reminder to residents that on-street parking is allowed during the winter months unless a parking ban is declared by the City or unless otherwise prohibited by on-street signage and the Motor Vehicle Act.

The temporary parking bans are declared to enable safe and effective snow clearing operations. When declared, it is the responsibility of the vehicle owner to have their vehicle removed from the street during identified hours. Any vehicle left parked on the street may be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.



An overnight parking ban can be declared for areas North, East and West when snow clearing is required. This parking ban is referred to as the "North, East and West Temporary Overnight Parking Ban".

The other on-street parking ban is on the South-Central Peninsula, where separate on-street parking bans will be declared by the City when snow clearing is required. This parking ban is referred to as the "South-Central Peninsula Temporary Overnight Parking Ban."

a 'Gender Equity' training module and incorporated language in the latest revision of the 'Ice Time Management and Allocation Policy,' which was approved by Common Council in July 2021.
