


City of Saint John Rockwood Park Redevelopment Project Phase III

Rockwood Park is a cornerstone of Saint John's recreational infrastructure and was clearly identified as being Saint John's most valued municipal park in Play SJ, the City of Saint John's Strategic Plan for Parks and Recreation issued in 2012. The goal of this project is to revitalize and enhance the usability and visual aesthetics of the Duck Pond and Interpretive Centre area.

Proposed Project Scope:



- Continuing lighting, multiuse trail, and roadway improvements (including culverts) from Lake Drive South to and along Fisher Lakes Drive
- Enhancement of the Duck Pond area, including landscaping, removal of the existing gabion walls, stabilization and reshaping the Duck Pond Banks
- 3 Enhancing accessibility of trail on North side of the Duck Pond
- 4 Improving and rehabilitating decking and stairs around the Interpretation Center
- 5 Upgrading the existing park gate (an electric gate is understood to be the preferred option)
- Developing protection at the Stonehammer Geosite and rock-climbing wall to improve safety for pedestrians and park users in this area

Total Construction Budget \$1.2 million

- Take into account the active season at the Rockwood Park Campground
- Ensure access to the Interpretive Centre at all time
- Prioritize public safety and minimize disturbance to the public's use of Rockwood Park
- Follow applicable environmental best management practices, and obtain and abide by all relevant regulatory requirements and approvals (DELG)
