Waste Wise Program details now available on Shape Your City Saint John


Beginning October 2022, following detailed planning, a successful pilot program and extensive community consultation, the City of Saint John will roll out the new Waste

Wise Program to all households that currently receive City garbage collection. The Waste Wise program will modernize and enhance the solid waste collection service for all customers by updating how and what the City collects at the curb.

The new municipal Waste Wise Program will include:

Curb-side pick up for recycling.

- Free green and blue bins for the proper separation and collection of recycling.
- A free garbage cart for the majority of households for safe, clean storage and collection.



- limit of one full garbage cart (approximately two large garbage bags)
- limit of two bags per by-weekly collection and one bag per weekly collection (for households that will continue to receive bag collection).
- Additional amounts will require the purchase of bag tags
- Curbside compost is an existing service that will continue to be offered under the new program.
- A bulky items pick-up service is also offered to all customers, by appointment by contacting Customer Service at 658-4455.

The new program is similar to those implemented in other communities, and is designed to benefit residents by providing a convenient way to recycle, extending the life of the regional landfill and helping protect the environment. It also enables the safer, more efficient collection of garbage with new helping-hand technology on the garbage trucks.

The Shape Your City Saint John community engagement website has all of the information related to the Waste Wise Program. On the site, the public can find helpful links, frequently asked questions, and a place to share tips and tricks for recycling and composting. Over the coming weeks and months, the page will be updated regularly to ensure residents have all the information needed to make a smooth and easy transition to the new Program.

Details announced for City's Transforming Transit Program

The City of Saint John is transitioning to an emission-free future with an ambitious goal to run all Saint John Transit buses on electricity by 2040. In a presentation to Council on June 13, the "Transforming Transit" plan was outlined, and includes several initiatives that will see comprehensive changes to the City's transit system which will include electric buses added to the fleet as well as an on-demand bus service to be rolled out later this summer. Freedom of the City ceremony an impressive success

Mayor Donna Reardon and Members of Common Council were pleased to bestow the Freedom of the City on the Royal Canadian Air Force's 403 Helicopter Operational Training Squadron on Sunday, June 12. The ceremony took place in King's Square and began with a military parade, followed by flypasts of CH-146 Griffon helicopters and a reading of the official proclamation by the Mayor.


Reversing Falls signage has been given a facelift

Community prepared for unexpected Ukrainian newcomers

A welcoming and collaborative group, consisting of representatives from the City of Saint John, Saint John Local Immigration Partnership, New Brunswick Multicultural Council, the Canadian Red Cross, and the Saint John Airport (YSJ) are actively working together to create a process should a Ukrainian newcomer(s) arrive unannounced at YSJ.

While YSJ is not an international airport, and the possibility of this happening is low, the group felt it was important to ensure clear steps are in place. Staff at YSJ have received information and contact numbers, and the Canadian Red Cross will be ready to assist individuals immediately after arrival. Local newcomer settlement service agencies will then be involved to provide further assistance.

Fundy Quay banners highlight the future of Saint John's waterfront
