#### New Brunswick's largest outdoor pickleball complex opens in Saint John

The City was happy to celebrate the grand opening of Pickleball Saint John's new complex on June 1. The installation of eight outdoor pickleball courts in east Saint John was supported through funding from the City and is the largest outdoor pickleball complex in New Brunswick! Congratulations to everyone involved!

The City reinvested into the dormant courts at the Forest Hills Complex in the summer of 2021. Parks staff cleaned the courts and provided divider fencing, windscreens, benches and garbages and Pickleball Saint John developed programming, provided equipment and hosted fundraisers.
