The City of Saint John is pleased to provide the following summary of some of the great news, updates and important information about what's happening in the City.



City of Saint John received first electric transit bus from Damera Bus Corp

On June 20, Damera Bus Corp (Damera) and the City of Saint John introduced the Karsan e-JEST at an

event on Long Wharf. The e-JEST is the first electric, low entrance, 20-foot transit bus in North America and will officially be added to the Saint John Transit fleet later this summer.

"Damera is incredibly proud to partner with the City of Saint John and Saint John Transit to bring cleaner transit to the city and support Saint John's transition to zero-emission transportation," said Raj Mahadeo, CEO of Damera. "Saint John Transit is establishing itself as a public transit leader by transitioning to



on-demand services with these buses. The size and quiet operation of the JEST is perfectly suited for residential areas and on-demand services. We hope this serves as inspiration for municipalities across the country aiming to do the same."

The City of Saint John is transitioning to an emission-free future with an ambitious goal to run all Saint John Transit buses on electricity by 2040.

Mayor Donna Reardon says staff and Council are onboard and ready to lead the way in New Brunswick, stating that "Green transportation is the future of public transit systems around the world, and the City of Saint John will be a part of it. We are not only a forward-thinking community, but also a forward moving one; known as a city of firsts, and for always moving forward."

Six 20-foot JEST buses will be put into service across Saint John this September as part of the City's Transforming Transit Program. The program, first announced in 2021, will transform the municipal transit system using electric buses and an on-demand bus service expected to be launched later this year.

Canada Day celebrations set to return to Saint John

A free Canada Day family swim will be open to the public at the Canada Games Aquatic Centre from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. (limited to the first 400 people) and the City Market will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Main Street Active Transportation Project open for public feedback on Shape Your City Saint John

As the City of Saint John continues to focus on finding ways to enhance the livability of our city, we are seeking public input into the proposed Main Street Active Transportation Project. This project will transform Main Street and the Viaduct to improve access and safety for walking, cycling, and transit on Main Street. The City is asking for public feedback through an online survey on Shape Your City Saint John.

The quick survey will help the City understand what changes residents would like to see and how they would use the newly designed Main Street as a transportation route. The survey will be open from June 27 – July 15, 2022.

The proposed project will include:

- Two of the six vehicle lanes converted to active transportation (i.e., cycling, walking) and more green space.
- A reduced speed limit.
- Protected bike lanes and shared bike/pedestrian spaces.
- Traffic calming measures at pedestrian and cyclist crossings.
- Improved Transit stops.
- Enhanced centre median to expand the Marigolds on Main project.

The annual line-painting program is underway with crews working on roads across the City

Did you know that each year the City of Saint John repaints over 600 crosswalks, 440 km of road and bike lanes, and over 2,600 various traffic symbols? Crews have already begun this year's program and will continue over the coming weeks and months.

Additional work completed in 2022 includes a reduction in traffic lanes on University Avenue from five lanes down to three to allow for the installation of bike lanes. Progress is underway for the addition of two new signalized crosswalks in the area as well.



Growth At A Glance

So far in June the One Stop Development Shop has received 65 building related permit applications with a value of \$2.9 million.

Year to date the One Stop Development Shop has received 327 permit applications with a value of \$60.7 million.
