The City of Saint John is pleased to provide the following summary of some of the great news, updates and important information about what's happening in the City.



First in-service electric bus added to Saint John Transit fleet

The future of green transportation in the City of Saint John took a big step on July 19 as the first full-sized, fully electric bus was officially put into regular service. The new bus was unveiled during a special ceremony to replace one of the diesel buses currently part of the Saint John Transit fleet.

"This event marks a major milestone in the transformation of the municipal transit system and highlights the City's commitment to cleaner, sustainable and green transportation," says Ian Fogan, Director of Saint John Transit. "When compared to a traditional diesel bus, this electric model will not only reduce carbon dioxide emissions by nearly 50 tons annually but will also save at least \$20,000 each year in fuel costs."

The 40-foot bus has a passenger capacity of 41 people, can travel almost 300 kilometres on a single charge and has a low floor making it fully accessible. The bus, which



takes just five hours to fully charge, was manufactured by BYD, the world's leading battery-electric bus manufacturer with more than 50,000 vehicles on the road globally.

"Green transportation is the future of public transit systems around the world, and the City of Saint John will be a part of it," says Nick Cameron, Chair of the Saint John Transit Commission. "We are taking bold steps towards becoming emission-free while also better meeting the needs of transit users."

The electric bus is one of the first signs that riders and residents will see around the Saint John area as part of the broader Transforming Transit initiative. The City has a goal of running all Saint John Transit buses on electricity by 2040.

City launches Slow Down and Stay Alert construction zone safety awareness campaign

With the summer construction season well underway, the City of Saint John has launched a six-week safety awareness campaign to remind motorists to slow down and stay alert when driving in and around road construction zones.

Whether it's a family member, friend, or neighbour, many of us know someone who works in roadside construction. Residents can help keep everyone safe this summer by following posted speed limits and being aware of workers and their equipment.

"With the increased work going on along our roadways this time of year, it's important for drivers to remember to use extra caution in construction zones so that they're not putting someone's life at risk," says Director of Public Works and Transportation, Tim



O'Reilly. "Road work can be a dangerous job, and we all have a shared responsibility to help keep these crews safe while they work."

Not only does driving carefully reduce the risk of injury or death to workers and fellow drivers, but residents are also reminded that speeding in one of these zones can result in double the minimum fine.

The Slow Down and Stay Alert campaign includes a variety of messages broadcasted on local radio stations and posted across the City's social media channels until the beginning of September.

All-female ocean racing yacht, Maiden, arriving in Saint John in two weeks

In a first for the City, Maiden, a 58-foot aluminum ocean racing yacht and her all-female crew will arrive in Saint John for a ten-day stop on August 3. Maiden will dock at Pugsley Slip in uptown Saint John, near the AREA 506 Waterfront Container Village from August 3-13.

Maiden's mission is to work with, raise funds for and support communities to enable girls into education, and empower and support them to remain throughout their teenage years to reach their full potential and create better futures for all.

There will be opportunities for the public to engage with the vessel and crew and private events will be hosted for local groups who work with girls in STEAM. There will also be a free screening of the <u>Maiden film</u> at the AREA 506 Container Village.

On Tuesday, August 9, DP World and Port Saint John are hosting a Maiden International Ports of Call fundraising dinner at the Marco Polo Cruise Terminal. 


Growth At A Glance

So far in July the One Stop Development Shop has received **47** building and development related permit applications with a value of **\$3.5 million**.

Year to date the One Stop Development Shop has received **390** permit applications with a value of **\$66.6 million**. There have been no high value permit applications in July as of this update.
