The City of Saint John is pleased to provide the following summary of some of the great news, updates and important information about what's happening in the City.



City asking for public feedback on the naming of the new public space at Market Slip

As site preparations continue for the Fundy Quay waterfront development, the City's Civic Commemoration Committee is inviting the public to help select a name for the (soon-to-be) newly redeveloped public gathering space near Market Slip.

The design elements of this new public space are rooted in the three foundations of the City: The Water, The Rocks, and The People. It will be a public space, a meeting place, and a destination for locals and visitors to enjoy. The public spaces are anticipated to be completed in 2023.



The public is being encouraged to submit name recommendations for this space using the following criteria:

- Recognizes a person, event, or group of people who have demonstrated exceptional service to the residents of the region
- Significance to the history and/or culture of the area
- Flora and/or fauna of the area
- Geographical or topographical features
- Must be original and not duplicates of other spaces or street names in the region
- Must not be offensive to a person or group of people
- Must not include parody, slang, inappropriate humour, or double meanings Names will be evaluated by staff based on appropriateness, cultural and historical significance, diversity, originality, and the relation to the design elements.

Feedback will be collected until Friday, August 26, 2022.

Latest Saint John Story Series features City's new artist-in-residence

The Saint John Community Arts Board recently announced its selection for the City's artist-in-residence for summer/fall 2022. Congratulations to Saint John resident Nathasha Pilotte, a visual and fibre artist and published author and illustrator, who officially began her residency in early August.

What's Happening Saint John

Nathasha will be splitting her time between the City Market and the Interpretation Centre at Rockwood Park, taking inspiration from the natural surroundings and using her artistic vision and skill to make a large-scale puppet from textiles and objects found within the park.

QR code payment option added to City's parking by-law

Saint John officially became the first city in Atlantic Canada to include the HotSpot secure QR code payment method in its municipal parking by-law. The City added the payment method to its by-law in July, after working closely with HotSpot over the last several years in developing a plan for parking technology upgrades. The City recently completed a trial of the new QR code technology as a alternative option to traditional coin-operated meters. The trial received positive feedback from users and the Saint John Parking department is currently developing a plan to make the QR code option more widely available across the City.

Another successful year for City summer student employment

Each year, summer student staff play a big role in providing excellent service to our residents and help to keep our City looking beautiful during the summer months. This year the City hired over 40 summer students including:

- 18 staff for the Sunshine Program
- 16 Student Labourers
- 2 Student Ambassadors for Saint John Transit
- 2 Interpretation Centre staff at Rockwood Park
- 2 Special Events Coordinators

The City is proud to offer employment opportunities to students in many different service areas.





Growth At A Glance

Development is on the rise in the Saint John region, with housing starts more than double pre-pandemic levels and outperforming 2021 by **80%** year-to-date.


Building permit values from January to June 2022 have also increased nearly **40%** above pre-pandemic numbers. For more details click <u>HERE</u>.

So far in August the One Stop Development Shop has received **33** building and development related permit applications with a value of **\$3.5** million.

Year to date the One Stop Development Shop has received **441** permit applications with a value of **\$72.1** million. There has been one high-value building permit application so far in August:

• 15 Golden Grove Road: \$1.3 million – Construction of Popeye's Restaurant
