Staying connected as a community: Duck Cove neighbourhood continues annual community picnic tradition in an area of Saint John that is rich with beaches, parks, and views September 29, 2022

For the past five years, residents of Saint John's Duck Cove neighbourhood have come together for an annual celebratory community picnic as a way of gathering as friends and neighbours and enjoying the place they call home.

"I'm never one to just sit around," says long-time resident and event organizer, Cathy Stringer. "Back in 2017, a group of residents from the neighbourhood got talking and decided that we should have a picnic in celebration of Canada Day. That's how the first one got started."

After hosting several picnics, they noticed many residents couldn't attend because of summer vacations, so they decided to move the date and hold it immediately after the return to school.

"We now have it one of the weekends in early September, usually just after Labour Day and we've had better attendance since making that change," says Cathy.
