The City of Saint John is pleased to provide the following summary of some of the great news, updates and important information about what's happening in the City.



Latest immigration data shows Saint John continues to head in the right direction

In a release of additional 2021 Census immigration and migration data on October 26 by Statistics Canada, the numbers for Saint John continued to show positive signs of growth. According to the data:

• Saint John attracted 2,490 immigrants between 2016 and 2021, a 228 per cent increase over the previous census period.

• The Saint John Census Metropolitan Area attracted 3,055 immigrants in total over that same period.

• The City of Saint John attracted 81.5 per cent of all immigrants living in the region, up from 78 per cent previously.



• 5,535 immigrants are now living in the City of Saint John; 45 per cent of all immigrants arrived between 2016 and 2021.

• 8 per cent of the City's residents are now immigrants; the Canadian Average is 23 per cent.

The City of Saint John Census population grew by 2,320 people in the last five-year census period to 69,895 in 2021. This means that net new immigrants accounted for the majority of the City's net positive population growth.

The City's new Immigration Strategy will be presented at the November 28 Council meeting.

New sculpture is officially unveiled in front of City Hall

The City of Saint John, in partnership with Uptown Saint John Inc. the business improvement association, and Sculpture Saint John officially unveiled a new piece of public art in front of City Hall on October 27.

Local artist Phillip Savage created the sculpture as part of the Sculpture Saint John Symposium held this summer. Titled *Portal*, the artist says the sculpture was inspired by both the natural formation of sand and stone along the ocean coast as well as the old stone arches of the past.

Since the Symposium's inception in 2012, 38 sculptures have been carved by artists from around the world. All pieces now make up the New Brunswick International Sculpture Trail, which runs from St. Stephen to Moncton.

Grand opening to be held for JDI west side community dog park

Pet owners in Saint John have a new area to bring their dogs, with a grand opening for the new JDI west side community dog park, located at 701 Dever Road, scheduled for Sunday, November 6 at 12 p.m.

The project has been primarily managed by the West Side Community Group. Funding for the park was a combined effort, with \$10,000 being provided through the City's LPP fund and \$15,000 contributed by J.D. Irving, Limited. The City has also contributed waste receptacles, benches, and dog waste bags.



In October, the One Stop Development Shop received **44** building and development-related permit applications with a value of **\$9.7 million**.

Year to date, the One Stop Development Shop has received **584** permit applications with a value of **\$91.8 million**.

- 408 Mill Street: \$5.4 million Foundation for water treatment facility
